WESS STAFFORD

AUTHOR AND FORMER PRESIDENT AND CEO OF COMPASSION INTERNATIONAL

Dr. Wess Stafford is an internationally recognized advocate for children living in poverty and president emeritus of Compassion International, which partners with more than 7,000 churches to sponsor nearly 2 million children in 26 countries. The son of missionaries, Stafford grew up in an Ivory Coast village, watched over by his wise and Ioving African "extended family." He began working with Compassion International in 1977, first serving in Haiti, and eventually served as president and CEO of the organization for 20 years. Stafford is the author of *Just a Minute: In the Heart of a Child, One Moment Can Last Forever* and *Too Small to Ignore: Why the Least of These Matters the Most*.



PASTOR ANN BILBREW PASTOR AND SOCIAL WORKER

Pastor Ann Bilbrew leads Living Springs Riverdale, a Reformed Church in America (RCA)congregation in one of Chicago's diverse south suburbs. Also a social worker for the Cook County court system, Bilbrew is especially passionate about helping women and families in crisis and leads a team of volunteers that offers empowering rather than enabling assistance. A member of the RCA's Multi-Racial Commission Team, Bilbrew shares her experiences with and insights about social injustice and racism. Bilbrew's Living Springs Riverdale congregation is a branch of Living Springs Community Church, Glenwood, Ill., which is pastored by the Rev. Dave Izenbart, a 1989 alum of Northwestern College.



SHELLY VROEGH

2017 IOWA TEACHER OF THE YEAR

Iowa's newest Teacher of the Year, Shelly Vroegh, teaches fifth grade at Lakewood Elementary in Norwalk, Iowa. She's also a lead mentor for the Norwalk Community School District, the elementary math curriculum leader, an instruction coach and helps coordinate a summer school program. At the award ceremony, Governor Terry Branstad praised Vroegh for being an example of how "great teachers really do change lives." Branstad noted Vroegh's strengths in her classroom and as a teacher leader in her district and explained that educators like her are contributing to the success of lowa's new teacher leadership and compensation system. Vroegh taught third grade for 18 years before moving to fifth grade two years ago.


Mother's room


