

# **Success in Meeting Program Goals**

#### **PA Program Goals**

1. Exceptional Training

To prepare students with the knowledge and skills necessary for entry into practice as a physician assistant to serve in all communities with an emphasis on rural and underserved populations

## **Outcome Measure A: Employment Rate**

- **Benchmark**: 93% of graduates will receive a formal job offer within 6 months of graduation
- **Summary of Program Effectiveness**: The NWC PA Program class of 2022 contacted graduates 6 months after graduation, and 96% of graduates reported employment. The program was successful in meeting the defined benchmark for the class of 2022 cohort. The program is committed to preparing students with knowledge and skills necessary for entry into practice as physician assistants. We will continue to monitor this benchmark as future graduates seek employment.

#### **Outcome Measure B: PANCE Performance**

- **Benchmark**: The NWC PA Program graduating cohort will achieve a first time PANCE pass rate at or above the national average
- Summary of Program Effectiveness: The NWC PA Program class of 2022 cohort achieved an 88% PANCE first time pass rate, which fell below the national first time pass rate of 92%. The program was unsuccessful in meeting the defined benchmark for the class of 2022 cohort. The program is committed to preparing students with knowledge and skills necessary for entry into practice as physician assistants and is further analyzing PANCE performance to determine data driven actions that can be taken to continue to improve the PANCE first time pass rate.



To integrate Biblical teachings into the medical curriculum so that graduates are prepared to serve with integrity and compassion


#### **Outcome Measure A: Exit Survey**

- **Benchmark**: At the completion of the program, students will be asked to provide feedback on their experience. The program strives to achieve an average of ≥4/5 on Likert scale, demonstrating that graduating students agree or strongly agree that the curriculum prepared them to serve with integrity and compassion.
- **Summary of Program Effectiveness**: Surveyed students from the class of 2022 reported an average Likert scale score of 4.25, successfully meeting the defined benchmark. The program is dedicated to integrating Biblical teachings into the medical curriculum to prepare students to serve with integrity and compassion. We will continue to monitor this benchmark by surveying future cohorts of students at the completion of the curriculum.



#### **Outcome Measure B: Didactic Survey**

- **Benchmark:** At the completion of the didactic year, students will be asked to provide feedback on their experience. The program strives to achieve an average of ≥4/5 on Likert scale, demonstrating that students agree or strongly agree that Biblical teachings were incorporated effectively into the curriculum
- **Summary of Program Effectiveness:** Surveyed students from the class of 2023 reported an average Likert scale score of 4.17, successfully meeting the defined benchmark. The program is dedicated to integrating Biblical teachings into the medical curriculum to prepare students to serve with integrity and compassion. We will continue to monitor this benchmark by surveying future cohorts of students at the completion of the didactic year.



### 3. Leadership Preparation

To train physician assistants who are collaborative leaders in their field, working with others to provide optimal medical care to patients


#### **Outcome Measure A: IPE Assignments**

- **Benchmark**: 93% of students will achieve 80% or higher on the IPE integration assignment in the course Clinical Reasoning II
- Summary of Program Effectiveness: The program was successful in meeting the defined benchmark for the class of 2022 cohort, as all students achieved a score ≥80% on the interprofessional education assignment administered in the Clinical Reasoning II course. The program is invested in training PA students who are collaborative leaders in their practice. We will continue to monitor this benchmark as we matriculate future cohorts into the program.

#### **Outcome Measure B: Exit Survey**

- **Summary of Program Effectiveness**: Surveyed students from the class of 2022 reported an average Likert scale score of 4.21, successfully meeting the defined benchmark. The program is committed to training PA students who are collaborative leaders in their field. We will continue to monitor this benchmark by surveying future cohorts of students at the completion of the curriculum.



### **Outcome Measure C: Preceptor Survey of Program Goals & Student Preparedness**

- Benchmark: Clinical preceptors involved in the instruction of students will be asked to provide feedback about their experiences with NWC PA students during the clinical year. The program strives to achieve an average of ≥4/5 on Likert scale, demonstrating that clinical preceptors agree or strongly agree that Northwestern College PA students have the ability to collaborate and lead effectively.
- Summary of Program Effectiveness: Surveyed clinical preceptors reported an average Likert scale score of 4.45 on the Survey of Program Goals and Survey of Student Preparedness, successfully meeting the defined benchmark for the class of 2022 cohort. The program is committed to training PA students who are collaborative leaders in their field. We will continue to monitor this benchmark by surveying clinical preceptors providing instruction to PA students.



#### 4. Diverse Learning

To provide an inclusive learning environment that enhances cultural competence and understanding of others


### **Outcome Measure A: Cultural Competency Course**

- **Benchmark**: 93% of students will achieve 80% or higher on the final paper in the course PA Professionalism II: Medical Ethics and Cultural Competency
- Summary of Program Effectiveness: The program was successful in meeting the defined benchmark for the class of 2022 cohort, as all students achieved a score ≥80% on the cultural competency course assignment administered in the Professionalism II course. The program is committed to providing an inclusive learning environment that enhances cultural competence and understanding of others. We will continue to monitor this benchmark as we matriculate future cohorts into the program.

We will continue to monitor this benchmark by surveying future cohorts of students.



#### Outcome Measure C: Preceptor Survey of Program Goals & Student Preparedness-

- Benchmark: Clinical preceptors involved in the instruction of students will be asked to provide feedback about their experiences with NWC PA students during the clinical year. The program strives to achieve an average of ≥4/5 on Likert scale, demonstrating that clinical preceptors agree or strongly agree that Northwestern College PA students are culturally competent
- **Summary of Program Effectiveness**: Surveyed clinical preceptors reported an average Likert scale score of 4.58 on the Survey of Program Goals and Survey of Student Preparedness, successfully meeting the defined benchmark for the class of 2022 cohort. The program is committed to providing an inclusive learning environment that enhances cultural competence and understanding of others. We will continue to monitor this benchmark by surveying clinical preceptors providing instruction to PA students.
